#### Explanation of the costs

a) Tuition fees for non-EEA students	<p>Tuition fees for 1 September 2024 – 31 August 2025 have been set at € 16,713 for all non-EEA students.</p> <p>Due to Dutch governmental policies, Hotelschool The Hague (and all other professional universities) are not funded by the Dutch government for the education of non-EEA students. Non-EEA students therefore pay higher tuition fees than EEA students.</p>
b) Visa costs	<p>Visa procedure Hotelschool The Hague</p> <p>The visa costs (€ 228) include a residence permit for 4 years and, if applicable, a provisional residence permit to enter The Netherlands. In the first week of arrival at the beginning of the academic year students will be informed about how to obtain the residence permit, open a bank account, register at the City Hall and all other important matters related to becoming an official resident.</p> <p>A residence permit will generally be issued for the duration of your study programme, provided that you obtain 50% of your European (study) credits every year (Nuffic).</p> <p>Non-EEA students accepted for Hotelschool The Hague are obliged to pay forthwith the total amount on page 2, to Hotelschool The Hague. After this amount has been received, Hotelschool The Hague will start the visa procedure immediately and inform the Immigration Department (IND) of the Ministry of Interior and Kingdom Relations. Hotelschool The Hague has made special arrangements with the IND to apply for a visa for non- EEA students via a shortened procedure. That means that you are not allowed to apply for a visa yourself.</p> <p>In order to receive a visa, non-EEA students in The Netherlands are required to have a minimum of approximately € 1,250 per month to cover their living costs (board and lodgings) – the minimum required is € 15,000 for the first year. This amount is excluding tuition fees. Computer/laptop	Although the school provides excellent computer facilities, we do advise students to purchase a laptop. Each student can log on to the school computer network by using their personal username & password as assigned by the IT Department. Throughout the school and at the Skotel rooms there are also wireless access points where you can connect to the Internet via your own laptop, mobile phone etc. using the 'HDH-HotSpot'. Please make sure you have a suitable portable device and either using a normal network cable (utp patch cable) or WiFi.
Books	Books can be bought from the school's supplier. Other lesson materials consist mainly of a course guide that contains important information for each course, such as the number of EC's it provides, who the lecturers are, etc. Workbooks and manuals provide additional reading material to supplement the books.
